Dear Professor Bacon:

Re: Establishment of a Disability Task Force

We are writing on behalf of the Executive Committee of the Faculty Association to strongly support calls from the Disabled faculty at UBC for the creation of a Disability Task Force. Working to dismantle barriers to disability inclusion and accessibility is vital to a thriving campus community. The call for a Disability Task Force is grounded in the following context at UBC.

The 2021 UBC Employment Equity Report finds that only 8.2% of all employees at UBC Vancouver and 12.2% at UBC Okanagan identify as living with one or more disabilities – significantly lower than the 29% of all British Columbians who identify as having one or more disabilities. Women and Indigenous people are more likely to have a disability, and the likelihood of developing a disability increases with age, meaning that disability has the potential to impact everyone.

Disability as an identity-based group has not been included in equity-related strategic initiatives at UBC, including but not limited to the Inclusion Action Plan (IAP) and the Strategic Equity and Anti-Racism framework (StEAR). Simultaneously, the need for a Disability Task Force is highlighted by both the Anti-Racism and Inclusive Excellence Task Force, and the Two-Spirit and Gender Diversity Task Force.

Therefore, the UBCFA Disability Working Group, which is a part of our Equity Committee, as well as our Executive Committee, unanimously supports the call for the creation of a Disability Task Force at UBC. We ask the Office of the President to create and resource a Disability Task Force led by members of the Disabled community who have identified and advocated for this urgent need. Thank you kindly for your attention to this matter.
